The garden was particularly floriferous in 2015. Cherries, damson, Judas tree, Pride of India, echium, hops, crocus, fritillaries and apothecary roses, all performed well. The William III bed looked wonderful in July with white antirrhinums and lavender. We had good autumn colour as well.

The cherries provided a good crop for jam making and as did the damson and both now have been (mostly) pruned. We had some pruning instruction from Andy Knight, Portsmouth City Council Arboriculturalist. Val and Sue did a magnificent pruning job on the limes. We also had professional help to raise the canopy of the old walnuts and we continue to worry about the new ones. Green Thumb have been working on the lawns.

The crocuses on the square lawn have lacked sun at the right time in 2016 but the tête-à-tête narcissi are really wonderful again under the new walnuts.

Cris continues with seed propagation and bulb and plant buying, the new spring bulbs are beginning to show through in beds and tubs. She leads on keeping the troughs looking good as well.

The Royal Marines planter has been kept up to scratch throughout the year led by Val but has now been cleared for refurbishment by Stephen Broad the carpenter.

We have ordered a new plant stand to be made by Peter Clutterbuck in keeping with his marvelous gates.
